WELCOME

Welcome to Aldridge SHS Golf Program. This handbook provides information, details and arrangements to help both students and parents understand what is being offered to support your son's/daughter's engagement and development. Through commitment and practice it is hoped that you achieve your golfing goals. The golf program at Aldridge State High School offers quality weekly tuition for keen and committed students across the Fraser Coast region.

Our golf academy has continued to evolve and enhance experiences for all junior golfers. With a high-quality coaching program and strategic approach to the game, our program offers every enrolled student, the chance to succeed. Through the support of the Maryborough Golf Club, our coaches and QIGA affiliation, this golf program offers students opportunities to take their game to the next level. The program allows enrolled students exclusive chances to compete in both individual and team tournament play against metropolitan school teams. We start all golfers as training players and develop students towards their own golfing goals. Aldridge invites **all Fraser coast golfers aged 11-18 years of age to sign up** and experience that Ryder Cup team atmosphere. Our program often makes up over 50% of the Wide Bay team and recent success has been achieved at the National Level with Lachlan Hancock (Aldridge) and State Level Allira Shingles (Aldridge/Urangan). ABOUT QIGA (OUR AFFILIATION)

Formed in 1996, the Queensland Intercollegiate Golf association offers a US College style format with teams of 5 players who represent their schools as part of an affiliated team. The QIGA boasts over 100 players that have become golf professionals along with countless state and territory representatives. A few names include Adam Scott (Kooralbyn), Jason Day (Hills), Amy Yang (Robina), Steven Bowditch (Kooralbyn). Over the years there have been several rule variations to allow teams to compete using their handicaps in separate team divisions. In the current format, teams compete both in a gross and net championship in the boys and girls divisions as well as a junior team stableford competition. Juniors can only come from years 8 or lower and can be any gender combination.

Our very own Golf Coach, Mr. Adam Hodgkinson, is the Assistant Manager for QIGA and organises all events for our school and our Queensland golfers.

HOW DO I ENROL AND GET INVOLVED?

AS AN ALDRIDGE GOLF PROGRAM MEMBER/PLAYER: \$ 150 ANNUAL FEE (PAYABLE ACROSS TERM 1,2,3 AT \$50 A TERM)

The Aldridge program runs from 7:45am to approximately 10:45am every Thursday morning. Lessons/skills practice take up the first 30 – 45 minutes and students then put these learnings into practice playing several holes.

The program covers the school virtues of commitment, respect and self-discipline. The school provides weekly tuition, supervision, practice balls, connection to a PGA Professional and transport back from the club to respective schools across the Fraser Coast. The annual fee includes club hire, green fees, fuel, as well as training resources and levies. This rate is comparable to \$1000-\$1200 in metro areas for the other 6 QIGA schools in our state.

RETURN BUS TRAVEL

Once students are dropped at the course or Aldridge SHS, return travel is offered at approximately 11:00am - 12:00pm for Maryborough based students and 12:00pm - 1:00pm for Hervey Bay students.

GOLF HANDICAP ELIGABILITY

The program uses Golf Australia Modules and SMART goals to develop a player's ability. When a student gains an AGU Handicap, they are invited to be part of our Tournament Squad. The tournament squad trains every Thursday at the Maryborough Golf Course and each player receives a scholarship to the value of \$500. This includes four annual QIGA tournament entries, QIGA green fees and a tournament shirt. The Aldridge Golf Program as part of QIGA (Queensland Intercollegiate Golf Association) competes in both individual and team tournament play against metro-based teams. QIGA Tournament eligibility requires golfers to be 11 years or older and have an AGU of less than 28.5.

AS A PRIMARY SCHOOL STUDENT- "WORKSHOP"- FREE

Our program offers 2-3 primary workshops each school term. Primary students need to gain permission from their primary school Principal, parents and class room teacher to attend. The workshops take place between 8:00am - 10:00am at the Maryborough Golf Course and return travel is offered in the Fraser Coast region. We also encourage and assist golfers to take up Maryborough Juniors Golf on Sunday mornings at 8:00am and Wednesday Hervey Bay Junior Clinics with Fraser Coast Performance Golf.

PARENT CHECKLIST: FAQ'S AND ATTENDANCE DETAILS – PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

- 1. I can confirm that golfers attending the Thursday morning sessions can make their own way to the Maryborough Golf Course or Aldridge SHS by 7:45am.
- 2. I can confirm that my school (if not based at Aldridge) knows of my attendance and permission has been granted by School Principal.
- 3. The Aldridge State High School Golf Program comes with an annual cost of \$150.00 and an initial \$50.00 first instalment is payable prior to starting/participating on Thursday mornings. Payable for high school students only.
- 4. I understand that my participation in the program needs self-discipline to keep up with school work as I could be absent each Thursday from 9:00am 11:30am.
- 5. It is expected that high school students attend 70% of Thursday sessions (7/10 weeks) each term, to maintain enrolment status and the program understands that academic and assessment commitments come first ALWAYS!
- 6. Aldridge SHS has no pressure on students to gain an AGU (handicap) but it is a requirement to travel with the school team as part of the tournament squad if wishing to attend QIGA events at a later date.
- 7. High school students must be enrolled at Aldridge State High School as either a <u>full</u> or <u>partial/provisional</u> enrolment to be eligible to partake in our program (provisional means 20% enrolment at Aldridge SHS for Thursday's).
- 8. Prior to receiving a sports uniform, students are to wear a school uniform or a sports-based uniform. A collared shirt is compulsory.
- 9. Supervision is provided by Aldridge SHS and schools are not required to send staff. Exemplary behavior and effort is always expected otherwise students will be removed from program.
- 10. Aldridge SHS receives no funding for this program. Our staff member, Adam Hodgkinson, holds a degree in Sports Development, Sports Psychology and is a Golf Australia Coach. He offers this program free of charge and does not receive any additional payments or allowances (he does this program in the 4 hours he gets off each week!).
- 11. Parents are welcome to drop off, stay and collect, however return travel is offered to Maryborough/Hervey Bay students each Thursday via our school bus.

TOURNAMENT SQUAD FURTHER INFORMAITION

- 12. Manager Adam Hodgkinson will inform parents of all details based around partial/provision enrolment, travel and competition formats but the QIGA registration, green fees and memberships are all covered by Aldridge SHS as part of this amazing opportunity.
- I understand that there will be only a <u>minimal cost</u> based around <u>travel and personal accommodation once a term</u> to Brisbane for QIGA events.

As part of our GOLF SCHOOL SPORTS PROGRAM-

Activity details

- Each Thursday students participate in training along with on-course play at the Maryborough Golf Club or Aldridge SHS
- The program is supervised by Adam Hodgkinson from 7:45am-11:15am
- There is no requirement for golfers to join the club as a member as this is a school based activity.
- Golf equipment is provided for new students- It is expected however that students can access own golf clubs after trial period
- If a golfer is selected to compete at a higher level-- this involves travel to Brisbane/Gold Coast Golf courses
- Inherent risk level of the activity (e.g. low/medium/high/extreme) and any risk management strategies that will be implemented have been listed and co-ordinated by QIGA and Aldridge SHS CARA documents
- Who will lead the activity and supervision arrangements: Mr Adam Hodgkinson
- Method/s of transport to be used: Own transport to and from golf course when travelling to Brisbane Events
- Return transport ONLY is offered for students on Thursday mornings.
- Accommodation to be paid and organised via parents if students make QIGA team
- Appropriate dress code for the activity has been advised to students as golf attire- collared shirt compulsory
- <u>Student Code of Conduct</u> (for P-12 students applies as this is a school based event)
- Any medical precautions to be taken should be listed by parent in medical forms (following pages)
- any information relevant to students/children with disability (e.g. reasonable adjustments made, specialised or additional support) and/or medical and individual requirements (e.g. diabetes, asthma, travel sickness, allergies or anaphylaxis, i.e. action plan).
