PREPARING FOR LIFE AFTER SCHOOL

Representatives from the University of the Sunshine Coast, CQUniversity, The University of Queensland, Griffith University, University of Tasmania, University of Southern Queensland, Queensland University of Technology, Australian Catholic University, TAFE Queensland and the Australian Defence Force shared valuable insights, while current university students spoke openly about their own transition from school to further study.

Students appreciated the opportunity to ask questions, compare pathways and start mapping out their next steps with confidence. Experiences like these play an important role in helping our young people feel informed, prepared and excited about what lies ahead.
